The Deed made the 21<sup>st</sup> day of October in the year 1878 between R. G. Briggs for trustee of the first part and W. Wickham of the second part both of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia, Whereas Washington Vaughan and Samuel Briggs, legal co-trustees claiming date on the 1<sup>st</sup> day of January 1874 recorded in the Clerk's Office of Southampton County, did bear gain well and convey with the said R. G. Briggs their entire lot or parcel of land lying in the town of Franklin containing or estimated a little over 4 1/2 of an acre of land, more or less, and bounded by a line beginning at the intersection of West Street and First Avenue, thence westerly along West Avenue to a swamp, thence westerly across of said Avenue, thence down said swamp in a short easterly direction to the southern terminus of West Street, thence northerly along West Street to its intersection with First Avenue, the point of beginning, in trust to and for the use of John Partridge, James Colburn and W. Wickham the fragments of fifty dollars and five cents which the said R. G. Briggs was empowered to sell the said lot of land on failure of the said Washington Vaughan to pay the said sum of fifty dollars as a mortgage by deed and whereas the said Vaughan failed to pay the said sum of \$50. The said R. G. Briggs in execution of the said trust as above created, did on the 1<sup>st</sup> day of September 1878, after fifteen days notice of time and place of sale, sell at public auction the lot or parcel of land as above described, which he let to the said W. Wickham because the purchaser thereof bought the highest bidder for the sum of thirty five dollars, plus therefor the Deed, it being that the said R. G. Briggs trustee in performance of his duties as trustee and for and in consideration of the said sum of thirty five dollars to him in hand paid by the said Wickham the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, doth grant and convey with special warranty unto and to the heirs and assigns of the said W. Wickham the lot or parcel of land as above described, which is being the amount which the said Washington Vaughan and wife conveyed unto the said R. G. Briggs trustee for the benefit of John Partridge, James Colburn and W. Wickham and for further description of said lot reference is made to the map of Franklin
