in supplies from the said David Turner to the amount of
two hundred dollars, beyond which sum the said Ephraim
Turner shall not go, and the said David Turner having
agreed on his part to furnish the said advances, to wit:
the said Ephraim Turner on his part in consideration of
the above premises does hereby give a bill to the said
David Turner, on the crops which may be made during
the present year upon the land in the cultivation of which
of which the above amount of advances has been expended.
This bill is granted under an act of the General Assembly
of Virginia, approved April 2nd 1873. Entitled an act
to secure advances for agricultural purposes. Witness the
