His Deed made this first day of December in the year one thousand and eight hundred and ten between David Hills the first party, and J. P. Puttow Trustee of the second party and the persons herein after named of the third party, witness that the said J. C. Hills doth hereby grant and convey unto the said Samuel P. Puttow Trustee as aforesaid, the following real personal estate, to wit, all of its land or parcels of land situated on the said executor now residing in Southampton County State of Virginia, and supposed to contain three hundred and nineteen and a half acres, more or less, and bounded on the north by the lands of John Drake & George Miller, on the east by the lands of Henry Hill, on the south by the lands lately belonging to Thomas Hills now deceased, and on the west by a certain Cigar; also the following personal property to wit, all of the said Hills personal effects, horses, cows, sheep, and cattle, to wit, all of the said Hills stock of horses, mules, oxen, cows, sheep, and twenty six swine, &c; all of the said Hills farming implements carts and sleds, one buggy - wagon harness, sleds, harness, & shores, sleds, pitchforks &c; all of the machinery, tools, &c; which the said Hills may have now in his possession, all his household & kitchen furniture of every kind whatsoever, all his cooking utensils, and all other right title and interest of every kind whatsoever which the said David C. Hills may have or have in equity, in proportion or contingencies in the estate of his father James Hills lately deceased, or in the estate of his brother Thomas Hills lately deceased. In trust to secure the payment of all such debts and demands of every kind whatsoever which may be owing from or put by him against the said David Hills as administrator of Warren Edwards deceased, whether the said debt were specially mentioned in a decree granted against the said Hills as Administrator as aforesaid at the May term 1783, & 1/2 of the Circuit Court of Southampton County not and further to secure from all labor & damages James Vaughan and Father P. Edwards senior to the said J. C. Hills as Administrator as aforesaid, in consequence of his said partnership - All the foregoing debts, demands and obligations of the said grantor are to be paid and fully satisfied in the first place before all others - And in the second place to secure several bonds notes and other accounts due to Mrs. Martha Edwards on a bill in all about three hundred dollars - and to secure also in the second place an open account due to Vaughan & Gay merchant in Franklin for about one hundred and sixty five dollars - During the ensuing months and all such articles as may be required by the law of the State Community called the Law for the protection of Poor Debtors.
