This Deed made this 22nd day of October 1798 between
 Leitchburk & Barden of Southampton County State of
 Virginia Grantors of the first part and Daniel B. Harrell
 Trustee for Sallee & Harrell, James S. Harrell and
 Pettie A. Caspeland his wife, M. J. Harrell & The said C. S.
 Barden of the first part Grantee of the second part. With us as follows, to wit: the said
 parties of the second part did by deed dated the 1st
 of Oct. 1798 bargain, sell and convey unto C. S. Bar-
 den all that lot and part out of land which lies at and
 near Dogkeys Depot Virginia, supposed to contain
 fifty acres more or less, bounded by the lands of Wm
 Benton & others and the public road leading from
 Dogkeys Depot to Newfordsboro. The said lot at
 said Depot being bounded on the north by the Rail
 Road East by C. M. Benton and South by the said
 W. M. Benton west by the County road and whereas
 the said C. S. Barden did execute three promissory notes
 dated the 27th day of September 1798 and pay able as
 follows first given for five hundred dollars with inter-
 est from the first day of January 1798 and due the first
 day of July 1798, the second 2nd On demand eight cen-
 tennial from the 1st day of January 1799 for five hundred
 dollars, and due the 1st day of January 1788, 3rd On
 demand with interest the 1st day of July 1799 for six
 hundred and twenty five dollars due the 1st day of July
 1882, Now S. Leitchburk & Barden for any and consid-
 eration of sixteen hundred and twenty five dollars
 bargain, bar gain, sell and convey unto Sallee Har-
 rell Jas. S. Harrell, and Pettie A. Caspeland and his wife M. J.
 Harrell and C. S. Harrell all my right and title to the above
 described lot and land to have and to hold the said
 described premises to their own use and beho of forever.
 In Witness whereof to secure the three above described
 notes, and the said C. S. Barden doth agree by the
 indenture that should hereafter be made any payment
 of the principal and interest on any part thereof of
 the said notes then it shall be lawful for the Trustee
 to advertise the above described property and sell the
 same to the highest bidder for cash, giving a reasonable
 time for said sale. Out of the proceeds of said sale
 pay the principal and interest of said notes and
 five per cent commissions on the amount of both
 to the trustee and the surplus pay over to the said
