Cobb of Southampton County, State of Virginia of the second part. Witnesseth, that in consideration of three hundred and twenty five dollars, the said Robt J. Neely and Elizabeth N. his wife and William Neely do grant, with general warranty, unto the said Henry V. Cobb his heirs or assigns all that certain tract or parcel of land, designated as lots nos 9, 10 & 11 and soed at Public Auction the same date of this deed, situated in Southampton County, State of Virginia.
