This agreement entered into this 14th day of February 1879, between George E. Beaton of the County of Southampton, State of Virginia, of the first part, and Jasper Beal of the County and State aforesaid of the other part (hereinafter that column, the said Jasper Beal is about to engage in the cultivation of the soil, at Jones & Johnson's and is desirous to obtain supplies during the year 1879, from the said George E. Beaton for the amount of one hundred fifty dollars and for taking the acknowledged receipt and for recording this agreement, and the said George E. Beaton, having on his part agreed to furnish said supplies, consisting of greater Expenses for hoes, goods &c. to aid in cultivating said crop. Now the said Jasper Beal on his part and in consideration of the above provisional debt hereby gives a Lien to the said George E. Beaton, on his entire Crops of every description, for the amount advanced to him this year, which has been or was intended to have been expended, and the said Jasper Beal binds himself agreeably to law, to deliver said George E. Beaton enough Cotton, corn, fodder, peas, or other products, at Brownsville Va by or before the 1st day of December 1879, to satisfy him for the advance herein mentioned And in case of default, the said George E. Beaton is hereby authorized to sell for cash a sufficiency of the Crops produced by said Beal, after giving ten days notice, to satisfy him for its amount of advance herein mentioned, he Beal paying the expenses of said sale. This Lien is granted under an act of the Genl. & Assembly of Virginia approved April 2^d 1878 entitled an act to secure the advances for agricultural purposes.
