Examined This agreement made and entered into this the 5<sup>th</sup> day of Feb'y A.D. 1849 between William J. Worrell party of the first part and Henry B. Kinard party of the second part. Witnesseth as follows: that whereas the said William J. Worrell is engaged in the cultivation of the soil on the lands of the said Henry Binkin and he the said Worrell having obtained supplies already and is desirous of obtaining more in all not to exceed the sum of two hundred dollars. The said Worrell in consideration of the supplies already furnished and more to be advanced during this year, not exceeding the above sum of two hundred dollars. Grants unto the said Henry Binkin a lien on all the crops raised on the said lands, also all hogs and stock. Giving the said Henry Binkin the right to sell said crops & stock as soon as they may be ready for market, and with the proceeds pay himself the amount which may be due and the surplus if any, pay over to the said Wm. J. Worrell. In consequence of this lien the said Henry B. Kinard warrants
