This Deed, made this 22nd day of January
Anno Domini 1879, between Margaret S. Wills
(wife of Groves L. Wills), and the said Groves
L. Wills of the first; Thomas J. Pielow, trustee
of the second part, and the parties herein often
named of the other part. Witnesseth, that the
said trustee of the first part do hereby grant
and convey unto the said party of the second
part, with general warranty, all that certain
tract or parcel of land which was on the day
granted and conveyed by Samuel B. Pielow
trustee, to the said Margaret S. Wills, and which
may be described as follows, to wit; all that
tract or parcel of land wherein the said now
C. Wills now resides, which is supposed to con-
tain three hundred and nineteen and a half
acres more or less, and is bounded on the
North by the land of John Scott and George
Miller; on the East by the lands of Harry
Webb; on the South by the lands lately be-
longing to Thomas Wills now deceased; and
on the West by the Chattooga River, and the
said parties of the first tract do further grant
and convey unto the said trustee, all of the
right, title and interest of every kind and
description, in possession, expectancy, servitudes
or remainder, both in law and equity, in and to
all of the personal or real estate which the
said Groves L. Wills may have heretofore had in
the estate of his father James Wills lately
deceased, and of his brother Thomas Wills lately
deceased, which ever the day granted
and conveyed to the said Margaret S. Wills
by Deed of Bargain and Sale from Sam
