

as to so much of its proceeds as may be necessary to defray the expenses of executing the same, the fees for drawing and recording the deed if then unpaid, and to discharge the amount of money then payable upon the said Bonds and if there be any residue of said fund money, the same shall be made payable at such time and secured in such manner as the said S. J. Worrell, his executors administrators or assigns shall prescribe and direct, or in case of a failure to give such directions, at such time and in such manner as the said Trustee shall think fit. The said S. J. Worrell commands to pay all taxes, assessments dues and charges upon the property herein conveyed. So long as he or his heirs or assigns shall hold the same.
