Know & That Deed made this 23rd day of January, one
thousand thousand and eight hundred and a twenty nine.
to H. P. Pope between Jno. J. Dwyer and Josephine J. his wife
and Col. Ferguson of the County of Southampton
tenant of the one part, and J. B. Prince claimant
trustee of the other part. Witnesseth that the said
parties of the first part, do grant with general
warranty unto the said J. B. Prince trustee as aforesaid
the following real estate to wit: a Tract of
Land in the County of Southampton Virginia con-
taining Twenty two hundred and three acres by
survey, more or less, and is part of the Farm
known as the Accure Quarter Farm and in which
the said Dwyer & Ferguson now reside, together with
all and singular the appurtenances belonging
to said Land. In trust to secure to H. P. Pope
his executors or administrators the payment
of the sum of Three thousand five hundred
dollars due by bond, and dated the 20th day
of January 1874 and carrying interest from
the date thereof and the said H. P. Pope, oblig-
ates to return the said Dwyer & Ferguson
the sum of the initial amount of three thou-
sand five hundred dollars, for a period of
not less than eight years, and longer if
so desired and convenient to him - provided
the said Dwyer & Ferguson, keep the interest
