year of our Lord 1878, between Alexander P. Johnson
of the first part and Martha Doyner the wife
of Garrison B. Doyner of the second part all
of the County of Southampton State of Virginia
Witnesseth that in consideration of the sum of
five hundred to the said Alexander P. Johnson
in hand paid by the said Martha Doyner the
said Alexander P. Johnson hath granted and by
these presents do grant with special warranty
unto the said Martha Doyner a Tract of land
containing one hundred and fifty acres bounded
as follows: North by Lightwood swamp, West by the
Heart lands, South by the Brodshoar land and by
East, by See cocke swamp. In testimony of which the
said Alexander P. Johnson as aforesaid has set his
hand and seal hereto the day and year first before
