This Deed made this 10th day of March in the year one thousand eight hundred seventy nine between Salathiel Lewis and Martha Ann Lewis his wife of the first part and James M. Blow of the second part Witnesseth that in consideration of the sum of, one hundred (\$100) Dollars the said Salathiel Lewis and Martha Ann his wife do grant unto the said James M. Blow with General Warranty, all that certain lot or parcel of land lying and being situated in the Town of Franklin, in the County of Southampton State of Virginia supposed to contain one half acre more or less, which said lot is shown and specially indicated on a map of the town of Franklin, as lot no 8. a copy of the said map of the town of Franklin is filed with the papers in the proceedings of a suit of Jas. Putlow Jr against Jethra Cobb and others. In said suit Thomas J. Putlow was Commissioner by virtue of a decree rendered at May term 1878, and of whom the said S. Lewis, became the purchaser at public auction, and bounded as follows: 18 feet on County road 20 feet by lot of land belonging to Richard Brown 75 feet by the lot of land belonging to Anthony Butler 82.5 feet on Mechanics Street.
