Now the said Turner & Barrow on their part and in consideration of the above provisions doth hereby grant a Lien to the said Dardue & Myrick on all the Crops of Corn, Tobacco, Cotton and Peas that may be made by the said parties Turner & Barrow for the above amount of advances which has been made or was intended to have been expended and the said Turner & Barrow binds themselves agreeable to law to deliver said Crops above mentioned to Dardue & Myrick at Newbern Depot T.C. by or before the first day of December 1879. This Lien is granted under an Act of the General Assembly of Virginia, approved April 7th 1873, intituled an Act to secure the advances for agricultural purposes.
