State of Virginia, a Homesteader and head of a
family do by virtue of an act of the General
Assembly of Virginia, approved June 27th
1870, hereby set apart and hold as a homestead
the following personal property for the benefit
of myself and family, except from sale,
for debt under any execution, Order or other
process to wit: One mare & colt of the value
of \$100 - One Saddle & harness \$25. Cart & wheels
for 2 Sows & pigs \$15. 11 head of Cattle \$100 - Horse
beds & Kitchen furniture \$100 - 700 lbs. of corn \$70 -
Fifteen barrels of corn \$45 - 1500 lbs. of fodder
\$15 - One Saddle & Bridle \$10 - and all my farm
implements \$25. The said property amounting
in the aggregate to the sum of Nine hundred
and twenty five dollars. Witness the follow-
