Witness that in as much as said Tom Urquhart
is engaged in agriculture and desires advances
and supplies to an amount not exceeding
forty five dollars and whereas the said
J. B. Prince are willing and have agreed
to furnish said Urquhart to an amount not
exceeding forty five dollars. Now therefore
the said Urquhart hereby gives and grants a
lien to said J. B. Prince upon 2500 lbs
seed cotton on two bales each to
weigh 425 lbs. and to be delivered at the
store house of the said J. B. Prince by
the 1st day of December 1879. Witness the fol-
lowing signatures.

not exceeding two hundred and fifty dollars, and also
one thousand Bellion & Addison, Star Brand fertilizer,
and whereas the said J. B. Prince are willing have
agreed to furnish said Tom Urquhart to an amount
not exceeding two hundred and fifty dollars and also
one thousand & his measure. Now therefore the said
Tom Urquhart hereby gives and grants a lien to said
J. B. Prince upon all his crops cotton, corn &c
or so much thereof as it will take to satisfy the
said debt. The measure to be paid for with 1/6 bale
Cotton grade "mitting" & to weigh each 450 lbs
