This deed made and entered into this the 15th
 day of April A.D. 1879, between Cuthbert E.
 Gordon grantor of the first part, and
 James J. Sanders, trustee of the second part,
 witness as follows: that whereas Cuthbert E.
 Gordon did sign as one of the sureties for
 L. Barden on an indemnity bond, for the bene-
 fit of King Knight, conditional for the delivery of
 certain property, which was listed on by M. J.
 Briggs Shiff and which is mentioned in said
 bond, the amount of the said bond being twenty
 five hundred dollars, and whereas the said
 Cuthbert has at different times advanced some
 sums of money amounting in all to thirteen
 hundred and seventeen dollars and thirty
 five cents to the said Cuthbert E. Barden.
 Now the said Cuthbert E. Barden for
 and in consideration of the said sum of
 thirteen hundred and seventeen dollars and
 thirty five cents, and to secure the said Gar-
 den from loss by reason of his
 signing any security on the above described indem-
 nifying bond do grant bargain and sell and
 by these presents convey unto the said James J.
 Sanders trustee as aforesaid all my right and
 interest in and to a certain tract of land
 near Payson's Depot and bounded by the
 lands of Wm. M. Beaton H. J. McKinstry H. J. Deloach
 It being the land on which I now reside, con-
 taining one hundred and sixty six acres more
 or less, I also bargain and sell unto James J.
 Sanders trustee as aforesaid all of my personal
 property viz: Horse racks and kitchen furniture
 new to carts and three pair wheels, farming uten-
 sils, fifty head of hogs, eighty bbls long corn, four
 tons and pounds of long feed, one yoke of oxen
 pounds of beans, three calves, twenty five hundred
 pounds of hams, and the ware of the above

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
