

Seventy Five  $\frac{1}{2}$  Dollars and for taking  
acknowledgment of this agreement and  
recording the same, and the said James  
& Myrick having on their part agreed  
to furnish said supplies, Now the said James  
Bynum on his part, and in consideration  
of the above provisions doth hereby grant  
a lien to the said Dardan & Myrick on all  
crops of Corn, Cotton, Peas &c that may  
be made by the said James Bynum for the  
above amount of advances, which has been  
made or was intended to have been expended  
and the said Bynum binds himself, equally  
to cause to deliver said above mentioned  
crops to Dardan & Myrick at Newson Island  
R.R. on or before the first day of December 1873.  
This Lien is granted under an act of the Gen-  
eral Assembly of Virginia approved April 2<sup>nd</sup>  
1873 entitled an act to secure the advances  
for agricultural purposes.
