to Law to deliver said above mentioned
Crops to Sardon & Myrick at newmarket
Va. on or before the first day of December 1879.
This Lien is granted under an act of the Gen-
eral Assembly of Virginia approved April 2nd
1873 entitled an act to secure the advances
for agricultural purposes.
