 is supposed to contain two hundred and twenty
 three acres more or less, and is bounded as
 follows; on the north and west by the said
 Joseph E. Warren; on the south by Nicholas Pitt-
 erson & James Battle; and on the East by the tract
 of land on which the said grantors now reside
 and which formerly belonged to the said James
 Cobb deceased. In trust to indemnify and
 save from all loss or damage the said Joseph
 E. Warren, by reason of his said suretyship
 and it is agreed by the said grantors that
 if the said Warren should, at any time here-
 after have to pay or suffer any damage in
 consequence of his said suretyship, the said
 Warren may immediately thereupon order the
 said Trustee to sell, at auction after having
 duly advertised the same, so much of the
 said real estate as may be necessary to in-
 demnify him, the said surety.
