Thomas W. Oliver and Alice S. his wife of the County
of Southampton State of Virginia grantors of the
first part and S. R. Edwards of the same County
and State chosen as Trustee of the second
part witnesseth that the said Tho. W. Oliver and
Alice S. his wife grantors aforesaid do grant
unto the said S. R. Edwards Trustee the follow-
ing personal property to wit: two bay horses
and also the following real property to wit:
a certain lot or parcel of land lying in
the Town of Franklin and bounded on the
south by 1st Avenue, on the east by the lot oc-
cupied by Rev. John Kitchin and belonging
to John Cobb, on the north by 2nd Avenue
and on the west by Frank Holland, lot con-
taining by estimation or half acre more or
less it being the lot purchased by said T. W. Oliver
at sale made by D. J. Prellow Commissioner and
