I, A. W. Norfleet, of the County of Southampton, Virginia, by virtue of an
act of the General Assembly of Virginia approved June 27, 1870, Entitled "an act to prescribe in what
manner and on what conditions, a Householder
or Head of a family shall set apart and hold
a Homestead for benefit of himself and family
except from sale for debt" do hereby claim a
homestead to the value of two thousand dollars
in the tract of land upon which I now live,
situated in the village of Franklin, containing
126 acres, more or less, and bounded by the lands
of W. G. Rawls, J. W. Edwards, John Petlar Jr. and J.
the Block water River; but this claim of homestead
is made subject to any existing valid leases, that
I may have created upon said lands. Witness my
