Blythe at Jerusalem or at Franklin $\frac{1}{2}$ by or before the 25th day of December 1879, namely, the crop made on the Farms of J. W. Williams this year when the said Colborn Hill mill will run. For the amount advanced to him this year which has been or was intended to have been expended and the said Colborne Hill mill binds himself agreeable to Day to deliver said Crops of Cotton, Cotton and Peanuts above mentioned to R. H. Blythe at Jerusalem or Franklin $\frac{1}{2}$ by or before December 25th 1879. This Lien is granted under an act of the General Assembly of Virginia approved April 2nd 1873 entitled an act to secure the advances for agricultural purposes.
