Witnesseth as follows: That whereas the said John Bryant is about to engage in the cultivation of the soil and is desirous to obtain supplies during the year 1879 from the said R. H. Blythe for the amount of fifty (50) dollars and for taking the acknowledgment and recording this agreement and the said R. H. Blythe having on his part agreed to furnish said supplies. Now the said John Bryant on his part and in consideration of the above provisions doth hereby grant a Lien to said R. H. Blythe on his crop of Corn, Cotton and Peanuts or sufficient thereof to pay the above amount in full. which crop he binds himself to deliver to the said R. H. Blythe at Jerusalem or at Franklin Va. by or before the 20th day of December 1879 namely the crop made on the farm owned or formerly owned by Beup. E. Worrell this year where the said John Bryant now lives. For the amount advanced to him this year, which has been or was intended to have been expended, and the said John Bryant binds himself agreeable to Law to deliver said crops of Corn, Cotton and Peanuts above mentioned to R. H. Blythe at Jerusalem or at Franklin Va. by or before the 20th day of December 1879. This lien is granted under an act of the General Assembly of Virginia approved April 2nd 1873 entitled an act to secure the advances for Agricultural purposes.
