Now the said Griffie & Whitehead on their part and in consideration of the above provisions doth hereby grant a lien to the said Darden & Myrick on all the crops of Corn, Tadder, Peas, Peanuts, and Cotton which may be cultivated by the said Griffie & Whitehead for the above amount of advances which has been or was intended to have been expended. And the said Griffie & Whitehead binds themselves agreeable to law to deliver said above mentioned crops to Darden & Myrick at Newson's Depot 79 on or before the first day of December 1879. This Lien is granted under an act of the General Assembly of Virginia approved April 2nd 1873 entitled an act to secure the advances for agricultural purposes.
