This Agreement entered into this 14th day of June
1879 between R. H. Blythe of the first part and
Benjamin Johnson of the other part, witnesseth
as follows: That whereas Benjamin Johnson has
engaged in the cultivation of the soil and is
desirous to obtain supplies during the year
1879 from the said R. H. Blythe for the amount of
thirty dollars and for taking the acknowledge-
ment and for recording this agreement and
the said R. H. Blythe being in his part agreed
to furnish said supplies, upon the said Benja-
min Johnson on his part and in consideration
of the above provisions doth hereby grant a
lien to said R. H. Blythe on the whole of his crop
of Corn, Cotton and Peanuts or sufficient
thereof to pay the above amount in full, which
crop he binds himself to deliver to the said
R. H. Blythe at Jerusalem or at Franklin Va. by
or before the first day of December 1879 that
being the crop made on the land where he now
lives near Jerusalem in the County of Southampton
Va. for the sum advanced this year which has
been or was intended to have been expended, and
the said Benjamin Johnson binds himself agreeable
to Law to deliver the said crop of Corn, Cotton
and Peanuts to the said R. H. Blythe at Jerusalem
or at Franklin Va. on or before the first day
of December 1879. His lien is granted under
an act of the General Assembly of Virginia
approved April 2nd 1873 entitled an act to secure
the advance for agricultural purposes.
