Deed

This Deed made this 1st day of June in the year  
 1879 between Thomas W. Oliver of the 1st part & Samuel  
 B. Prettler of the 2nd part all of the County of  
 Southampton & State of Virginia. Witnesseth:  
 That the said Thomas W. Oliver doth grant  
 unto the said Samuel B. Prettler the fol-  
 lowing property to wit: all of his crop of  
 Peanuts & Cotton to be raised during the  
 year 1879 in the County of Southampton, in trust  
 to secure a certain Bond held by John Prettler Jr.  
 & executed by the said Thomas W. Oliver  
 to the said John Prettler Jr. for the sum of  
 One Hundred & twenty five \$00/00 dollars bearing  
 date June 1st. 1879, but due November 1<sup>st</sup>. 1879.  
 And it is covenanted between the parties, that in  
 the event of the death of said Thomas W.  
 Oliver before the sowing of said crops here-  
 after
