This Deed made the 1st day of October 1878, between Jethro Cobb of the County of Southampton State of Virginia grantor of the first part, and Louisa J. Denow of the same County, State grantee of the second part, witnesseth that in consideration of the sum of One Hundred and seventy five dollars to him paid by the said Louisa J. Denow the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, by the said Jethro Cobb grantor aforesaid doth grant & bargain and sell with general warranty unto the said Louisa J. Denow the following real property to wit: a certain lot or parcel of land lying in the Town of Franklin, bounded as follows, Commencing at the said east intersection of 4th Avenue and High Street, thence in a Southerly direction along the eastern boundary of High Street, two hundred and ten feet to third (3rd) Avenue thence in an easterly direction along the Northern boundary of 3rd Avenue one hundred and five (105) feet, thence in a Northerly direction parallel with the High street boundary two hundred & ten feet (210 ft) to the Southern boundary of 4th Avenue, thence in a westerly direction along its Southern boundary of 4th Avenue one hundred & five (105) feet to the point of beginning, it being the lot of land comprising the two lots known and marked on the map of Franklin as number 42-543, and assigned to the said Jethro Cobb by Commissioner appointed to "assign allot &c" the lands in the Town of Franklin belonging to John Prentiss Jr. late containing by estimation one half acre more or less together with all improvements and appurtenances thereto belonging to her the said Louisa J. Denow and her heirs forever, Witness the following signatures and seals.
