of the soil and is desirous to obtain supplies
during the year 1879, from the said B. E. Worrell & Co.
& Pope & Gillette for the amount of Forty (\$40.00)
Dollars and the said B. E. Worrell & Co. & Pope & Gil-
lette having agreed to furnish said supplies, and
in consideration of the above advances and
promises, the said Thos. Wynn does hereby grant
a lien to the said B. E. Worrell & Co. & Pope & Gillette
on all the crops which may be made during
the year 1879 upon the land which the said Thos.
Wynn does cultivate or has cultivated by
tenants, for the amount of above advances.
And it is further agreed by the said parties to
this agreement that the crop above referred to
is to be delivered to the said B. E. Worrell & Co.
and Pope & Gillette on or before the 1st day of
