This Deed of Bargain and Sale, made this 22nd day of Sept
1879, between George C. Worrell of the one part and Rachel
Hardy of the other part, all of the County of Southampton, and State
of Virginia, Witnesseth, That for and in consideration of the sum of
Twenty dollars in hand paid, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, do grant bargain, sell and convey unto the said Rachel
Hardy & certain piece of Land lying in Haggerty Run, in the
County of Southampton, and State aforesaid, and bounded by the
Lands of J. B. Pinner, Junior & Son and others, Commencing at a pine
tree in the Pinner line at the road leading from Jerusalem, to Franklin,
thence along said Road to a Gum tree in a Northerly direction to a
Oak & Pinner in the Old Olive Church property, thence along the
line of the said Church's property to J. B. Pinner's line, thence in a
Northerly direction along J. B. Pinner's line to the beginning, and
supposed to contain three acres, be the same more or less, to her and
her heirs forever. The right and title to said Land I warrant
quietly. In Witness whereof, I have hereunto set my hand,
