This Deed made the 12th day of November
A. D. 1879 between Benj. E. Pope and Caroline R.
his wife of the County of Southampton in
the State of Virginia, of the one part and
John C. Vinson of Northampton County North
Carolina of the other part, Witnesses: That in
consideration of the sum of Fifteen Hundred
Dollars the said Benj. E. Pope and Caroline R.
his wife do grant with special warranty unto
the said John C. Vinson and to his heirs and
assigns forever the following real estate to wit:
A tract of land containing one thousand and
eighty (1080) acres more or less, lying partly in
Southampton County, Virginia and partly in
Northampton County, North Carolina and
known as the "Edmonds Farm" and bounded
North by the Meherrin River, East by the lands of
S. W. Wood, West by the lands of Silas Tallon & South
being the same land which was conveyed by
Wm. H. Beator and wife to said Benj. E. Pope
by deed dated the 10th day of May 1875 together
with all and singular appurtenances belonging
to the same. And the said Benj. E. Pope, the seller
to the said tract or parcel of land against
himself and his heirs and all persons
claiming by, through, or under him, with forever
war and defend.
