This Deed made this 14<sup>th</sup> day of November, Anno Domini Eighteen hundred and seventy nine, betwixt W<sup>m</sup> Walter White, of the first part, James E. Sobrell, Trustee, of the second part, and Henry M. Beuth of the third part, all of the County of Southampton, State of Virginia. Witnesses: That the said W<sup>m</sup> Walter White doth hereby grant and convey, with general warranty, unto the said J. E. Sobrell, Trustee as aforesaid, all that certain tract or parcel of land lying and situate, in said County, and which was granted and conveyed to the said White, by Deed of Bargain and Sale of even date with this Deed, from Patrick S. Brewery Special Commissioner - which said tract is supposed to contain about four hundred acres, more or less and is bounded by the lands of the said White, Miss Sally ~~Cott~~ Cott & others; - it being the same tract of which Spratly Simmons deceased was seized and possessed in his life time, and which descended to his heirs at law, was sold by said Brewery as special Commissioner, for partition among said heirs at which sale the said White became the purchaser: - In trust - to secure the payment of the following debt due from the said White to the said Beuth, by bond; - to wit, one bond for Ninety hundred and thirty four dollars & nineteen cents (\$934.19 cents) of even date with this Deed.
