Whereas, by deed of record, in the Clerk's Office of
Southampton County, dated the 3rd day of February 1878
Thos. Ridley & M. A. B. Ridley his wife, did convey to Mrs.
Urquhart wife of J. H. Urquhart, a certain tract of
land, authorizing her, by said deed, to apply to a court
of Chancery, for the appointment of a trustee for the
purpose of granting, selling or disposing of any part
or of said tract, not exceeding two hundred & forty two
acres, & of executing a sufficient & legal deed therefor
& whereas by decree of the Circuit Court of Southam-
pton, at its June Term 1878, said J. H. Urquhart
was appointed such trustee for his said wife
Now, therefore, this deed made this 1st day of January
1879, between J. H. Urquhart Trustee, as aforesaid
of the first part & C. M. Driser of the second part,
witnesseth, That for & in consideration of the premises
The sum of Ninety four & 50/100 dollars, to him in
hand paid, at or before the sealing & delivery of these
presentes receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged
the said J. H. Urquhart, Trustee hath given, granted,
Bargained & Sold, & does by these presents give,
grant, bargain & sell unto the said C. M. Driser
with special warranty, all of a certain tract
parcel of land, lying & being in the County of
Southampton, bounded by the lands of C. M.
Driser, John S. Coker & said Urquhart & containing
thirty one & a half acres more or less, beginning
at a large pine corner, in the line between the
Briggs tract & Urquhart, for Coker, thence along
the old Briggs line, a northeasterly course to a
gum corner on Bristers Branch, thence up
Bristers Branch to a crooked pine corner,
thence along a new chopped line S. 70. 9th to a
white oak on Cokers line, thence along Cokers
line to the point of starting to have & to hold
the said C. M. Driser and his heirs forever
