Gay of the same County and State, trustee of the second part witnesseth that in order to secure the payment of two (2) bonds due Cecil B. Vaughan, Elizabeth W. Crumpler & Joseph A. Gay to be hereinafter described, he the said Burrows doth grant and convey unto the said Littleton A. Gay the following ^{property} property to wit: Four hundred & fifty bushels peanuts (his entire crop which he had remaining on his the said Burrows farm) both on and off the vines. Fifty barrels of corn, two thousand lbs. fodder - his entire crop of Peanut Vines, Fifteen hogs (15 hogs) two Milch Cows, one Steer, two horses, two carts, four plows, one Clock, One table, in trust to secure the above named bonds, and as above written by the said Burrows, unto the said Vaughan & others, each bond being for \$37.50 (Three hundred, thirty seven & 50/100 dollars) and bearing date the 1st day of January 1878 and payable one and two years after date, respectively with interest from date. And should the said Burrows make default in payment of the same when demanded, then the said Trustee shall sell the above named property for cash, after advertising the same 15 days, and apply the proceeds of said sale as the law directs.
