Ridley and Elizabeth N. his wife parties of the second, part witnesseth, That in consideration of the said F. T. Ridley and Elizabeth N. his wife conveying unto the said R. J. Neely and J. Turner White, all the right title interest and estate of her the said Elizabeth N. Ridley wife of F. T. Ridley in all the lands of said F. T. Ridley which were sold by J. H. Arguehart Special Commissioner in the suit of Ridley vs Ridley, in the Circuit Court of Southampton County, on the 16th day of Decr 1898 to said R. J. Neely and J. Turner White, they the said R. J. Neely and Elizabeth N. Neely his wife and J. Turner White doth grant bargain and sell unto the said Elizabeth N. the wife of F. T. Ridley for and during her natural life so much of the "Homestead Tract" formerly owned by the said F. T. Ridley as is bounded as follows, to wit: On North by land of Charles Holt On the East by County Road leading from Pond Shop to the Bullfield Road, on the South by Pond land and James Branch and on the West by Hallus Mill Pond and Anglica Swamp, with the homestead residence & all buildings containing about 760 7/10 acres, the said Elizabeth N. Ridley to pay all taxes and assessments of the said tract of land and keep the buildings thereon in good repair. And the said F. T.
