 by L. O. Holt a householder & head of a
 family of the County of Southampton, State
 of Virginia, witnesseth that the said L. O. Holt
 doth hereby declare his intention to claim
 and doth hereby claim a homestead
 by virtue of an act of the Genl. Assembly
 approved June the 27th, A. D. 1870 in and
 to the following property, real and
 personal, to wit for the benefit of himself
 his wife Mollie D. his child James A. Holt
 and such other children as may be born
 hereafter unto him in lawful wedlock
 tract of Land supposed to be two hundred
 & sixty acres valued at \$1200⁰⁰ one Sorrell
 Horse valued at \$50⁰⁰ Forty Bbls. Corn
 valued \$120⁰⁰ four Thousand pounds
 Todder valued at \$40⁰⁰ one Buggy valued
 at \$50⁰⁰ Household & Kitchen furniture valued
 at \$500⁰⁰ all of which said property is claimed
 as a Homestead exemption, to be exempted
 from levy, seizure, garnisheeing or sale
 according to said act of assembly.
