This Deed made this 16th day of December 1879 by L. O. Holt a householder & head of a Family of the County of Southampton, State of Virginia, Witnesseth that the said L. O. Holt doth hereby declare his intention to claim and doth hereby claim a homestead by virtue of an act of the Genl. Assembly approved June the 27th A. D. 1870 in and to the following property, real and personal, to wit: for the benefit of himself his wife Mollie D. his child James A. Holt and such other children as may be born hereafter unto him in lawful wedlock tract of Land supposed to be two hundred & sixty acres valued at \$1200.⁰⁰ one Sorrell Horse valued at \$500.⁰⁰ Forty Bbls. Corn valued at \$120.⁰⁰ four Thousand pounds of Tallow valued at \$40.⁰⁰ one Buggy valued at \$50.⁰⁰ Household & Kitchen furniture valued at \$50.⁰⁰ all of which said property is claimed as a Homestead exemption, to be exempted from levy, seizure, garnishment or sale according to said act of assembly.
