Know all men by these presents that I John P. McClenney am held and firmly bound unto A. K. B. Cobb in the just and full sum of five hundred dollars, and as to this amount I hereby waive my right to claim the Homestead Exemption. Now the condition of the foregoing obligation is such that whereas the said John P. McClenney has the 15th day of August 1877 rented unto the said A. K. B. Cobb the room and rooms occupied by him the said McClenney as a grocery and bar and has also sold unto the said Cobb his the said McClenneys entire Stock of liquors and bar fixtures, and has contracted with the said Cobb that he shall have the exclusive privileges of dealing in Liquors on the entire premises of his the said McClenneys during the term of one year with the privilege of three years from the date of this bond and whereas the said McClenney binds himself neither to deal in or sell liquors himself nor to allow any one other than the said Cobb to sell or deal in liquors on said premises for said period of one to three years from date of the bond. Now therefore if the said McClenney shall fully comply with said contract by allowing the said Cobb exclusive privilege of dealing in liquors on said premises then the above obligation shall be void otherwise in full force and effect.
