and in consideration of the sum of Ten
dollars, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowl-
edged, the party of the first part have barge-
ained and sold and by these presents do
bargain and sell, convey and confirm
unto the party of the second part his heirs and
assigns forever all that certain piece or parcel
of land lying and being situated in the
County and State aforesaid and bounded
and described as follows: On the East by
Gullberry Swamp and the lands of Mill E.
Edwards, and on the north by a line beginning
at a dogwood tree acrosser on James Vaughan
for Seamore Vaughan and Harrison Cobb
tract, said line running North $71\frac{1}{4}^{\circ}$ East
along a line of marked trees to an all in
Gullberry Swamp, said all a corner for
this tract on Thomas Holland containing
twenty acres more or less. The above described
tract being a part of the tract on which
Seamore Vaughan now resides, lying
between the lands of James Vaughan
