 highest bidders became the purchasers of
 the tract hereinafter described at the price of
 one \$400 Dollars per acre. And whereas by a
 decree pronounced in said cause at the
 April Term 1877 the said Court confirmed the
 said sale and authorized and directed the
 said Special Commissioner to collect the
 bonds given by the purchasers of the said
 tract of land for the deferred installments
 of the purchase money at their maturity.
 And whereas the whole of the said purchase
 money has been paid and the collection
 thereof reported to ^{the} Court. And whereas by a
 subsequent decree pronounced in said
 cause at the October Term 1879 the said Court
 did order and decree that the said John
 Goode Special Commissioner as aforesaid
 should convey by deed with special
 warranty to the said R. S. Boykin and S.
 W. Urquhart the tract of land bought by
 them and specified in the report of sale.

 S. W. Urquhart the receipt whereof is hereby
 acknowledged, has granted, sold and
 conveyed and does hereby grant sell and
 convey unto the said R. S. Boykin and S. W.
 Urquhart and their heirs forever with
 special warranty the following property to wit
 that certain tract or parcel of known as the
 Igo tract in Southampton County whereof
 the said James B. Urquhart died seized and
