Grizzard also of the above County and State aforesaid of the second part witnesseth, that the said party of the first part, in consideration of the sum of one hundred and fifty dollars in hand paid (the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged) have granted bargained & sold and by these presents do grant, bargain and sell unto the said parties of the second part their heirs and assigns, all that piece or parcel of land situated in the above County & State aforesaid lying West of the County road, which runs over the flat Swamp bridges, commencing at a pine near the line of the Jones Farm which is marked, thence straight down the road as it now runs to the flat Swamp bridges, taking all the land on the west side of the Road, belonging to the party of the first part supposed to contain fifteen acres more or less.
