

E. Good. This deed of trust made and entered into this 16th day of February 1880. between Richmond Preston grantor of the first part and W. W. Turner trustee of the second part witnesses that Richmond Preston doth grant and bargain and sell unto W. W. Turner trustee as aforesaid seven hundred pine and cypress logs now cut and lying on the lands of John Britts Alexander Scholar and others. In trust to secure to C. C. Williams the sum of \$113.32 cts and to John P. Bland the sum of \$41.80 cts. and it is hereby stipulated and agreed that the trustee W. W. Turner shall at once take possession of the said logs and deliver them at Messrs Johnson and Lewis Saw mill and receive the money for the said logs at the price heretofore agreed on between Messrs. Johnson & Lewis and Preston, and pay to Messrs. Williams and Bland the above named sums of \$113.32 cts and \$41.80 cts and the balance of the money if any pay over to Richmond Preston, as witness the following signatures and seals
