Whereas W. A. Jones of Southampton County is engaged in the cultivation of the soil and desires advances in supplies during 1880 to the amount of one hundred and fifty dollars and whereas P. S. Thomas of said County does hereby agree to furnish him to an amount not exceeding said sum of one hundred dollars, now therefore this agreement made and entered into this 10th day of February 1880 between the said Jones and the said Thomas, Witnesseth that the said Jones does hereby give and grant to the said Thomas a lien of five bales of lint cotton of four hundred pounds each of the first pickings of the crop grown by the said Jones in 1880 to secure payment for the advances in supplies aforesaid. The said Jones further agrees to deliver to the said Thomas as soon as the said cotton shall have been severed, so much thereof as may be sufficient to pay for the advances aforesaid.
