Whereas Jim Woodson of the County of Southampton
is engaged in the cultivation of the soil and
is desirous to obtain advances in money supplies
during the year 1880, to the amount of one hundred
and twenty five dollars and whereas P. Thomas
of said County does hereby agree to furnish
him to an amount not exceeding the said
sum of one hundred and twenty five
dollars, now therefore, this agreement made
this 23rd day of January 1880, Witnesseth:
That the said Jim Woodson does hereby
give and grant to the said Thomas a lien
on all the crops which may be grown by
the said Woodson in 1880, to secure payment
for the advances aforesaid, as provided in
Chap 363 of an act of the general Assembly
of 1872-3 &c. The said Woodson agrees to deliver
to the said Thomas, or his authorized agent, at
