This Agreement entered into 22^d day of Jan'y: 1880 between
Lys. W. Turner and J. E. P. Turner merchants and partners
trading under the firm name of Turner & Bro., of one
part, and Major Jordan of the other part. Witnesseth:
That whereas the said Major Jordan is about to engage
in the cultivation of the soil, and is desirous to obtain
during the year 1880 advances, in money or supplies,
from the said Turner & Bro., to the amount of First
Five Bales cotton to weigh 1150 lbs. ea. valued at 90
Dollars, beyond which limit the said Major Jordan
shall not go, and the said Turner & Bro. having agreed
on their part, to furnish the said advances, now the
said Major Jordan on his part, in consideration of
the above promises, doth hereby grant a lien to the
said Turner & Bro., on the crops which may be made
during the year 1880, upon the land in the cultivation
of which the above amount of advances has
been or was intended to have been expended.
This lien is granted under an act of the General
Assembly of Virginia, approved April 7, 1873,
entitled "An Act to secure Advances for Agricultural
Purposes." Witness the following signatures
