Examd. This Agreement entered into this 12th day of Jan^y 1880
 between Eys. W. Turner and J. E. P. Turner, merchants
 and partners, trading under firm name of Turner
 & Bro., of one part, and J. V. Cland of the other part.
 Witnesseth: That whereas the said J. V. Cland is
 about to engage in the cultivation of the soil, and
 is desirous to obtain during the year 1880, advances
 in money or supplies, from the said Turner & Bro.,
 to the amount of Four First Bales cotton to weigh
 4500 lbs ea. valued at 180 Dollars, (cotton to be delivered
 1st Novr: 1880) beyond which limit the said J. V.
 Cland shall not go, and the said Turner & Bro.
 having agreed, on their part, to furnish the
 said advances, now the said J. V. Cland on his
 part, in consideration of the above premises does
 hereby grant a lien to the said Turner & Bro. on
 the crops which may be made during the year
 1880, upon the land in the cultivation of which
 the above amount of advances has been or was
 intended to have been expended. This Lien is
 granted under an Act of the General Assembly
 of Virginia, approved April 2, 1873, entitled "An
 Act to secure Advances for Agricultural Purposes."
