C. B. Williams

This Agreement made this 8th day of March in the year 1880, between C. B. Williams of the first part, and John Wiggins of the other part, both of the County of Southampton, State of Virginia: Witnesseth as follows: Whereas, the said John Wiggins is engaged, in, or is about to engage in the cultivation of the soil, and is desirous that the said C. B. Williams shall during the present year make certain advances to the said cultivator of the soil, which the said C. B. Williams has agreed to do. Now this Agreement witnesseth, That the said C. B. Williams does hereby promise and agree to advance and furnish to the said John Wiggins, during the present year, such monies, provisions, fertilizers and other supplies, (not exceeding the sum of one hundred dollars in amount) as may be needful to enable the said John Wiggins to cultivate and gather his crops proposed to be made the present year. And the said John Wiggins hereby gives and grants to the said C. B. Williams, a lien upon all such crops as he may make the present year, to wit: Corn, Fodder Peas, Beans, Cotton and all other crops, in order to secure the payment for all such supplies and advances as
