End - This Agreement made this 13th day of March in the
year 1880, between C. C. Williams of the first part, and
Sally Higgins of the other part, both of the County of
Southampton State of Virginia; Witnesseth as
follows: Whereas, the said Sally Higgins is engaged
in, or is about to engage in the cultivation of the
Soil, and is desirous that the said C. C. Williams
shall during the present year make certain
advances to the said Cultivator of the Soil, which
the said C. C. Williams has agreed to do, According
this Agreement Witnesseth; That the said C. C.
Williams does hereby promise and agree to
advance and furnish to the said Sally Higgins
during the present year, seed, manures, provisions,
fertilizers and other supplies, (not exceeding the
sum of Fifty dollars in amount) as may be
necessary to enable the said Sally Higgins to
cultivate and gather her crops proposed to be
made the present year. And the said Sally
Higgins hereby gives and grants to the said
C. C. Williams, a Lien upon all such crops as
she may make the present year, to wit: Corn
Fodder, Peas, Peanuts, Cotton, and all other crops
