

having on his part agreed to furnish the said Advances now the said Warby Moody on his part in consideration of the above premises does hereby grant a Lien to the said Joshua H. Powell upon all Crops that may be made on the Lands cultivated by the said Warby Moody during the year 1880. The said Warby Moody further agrees to deliver to the said Joshua H. Powell all Cotton and other produce made on said lands during the year to satisfy his amt. as aforesaid and after all claims held by the said Joshua H. Powell is settled, balance of said proceeds is to be paid over to the said Warby Moody or his assigns. The said Joshua H. Powell also agrees to furnish the said Warby Moody with sufficient Team and implements to carry on said farming operations. The said Warby Moody in consideration further agrees that said Lands shall be tilled in good order, if not the said Joshua H. Powell is to hire sufficient Labor to carry on said farming operations, and to charge expenses of said Labor to the said Warby Moody, and deduct the expenses of said Labor from the said Warby Moody's proceeds at the fall 1880 as aforesaid. This Lien is granted under an Act of the General Assembly of Virginia approved April 2nd 1873 entitled "An act to Secure Advances for Agricultural Purposes." Witness the following signature

Whereas John M. Jones of Southampton County is engaged in cultivation of the soil and is desirous to obtain advances in 1880 to the amount of Fifty Dollars and whereas P. S. Thomas of said County does hereby agree to furnish him to an amount not exceeding said sum of \$50. Fifty dollars more therefore the said Jones does hereby give and grant to said Thomas a lien on one thousand pounds Seed Cotton of Crop grown by said Jones in the first pickings excepting however a sufficient quantity to pay for Guards used on said Crop, to secure payment for advances aforesaid. The said Jones agrees to deliver to said Thomas as soon as severes the said Seed Cotton to pay for the advances aforesaid. Witness our Signatures and Seals this 13th day of March 1880.
