This Deed, made this 15th day March 1889, between Geo. W. Prince of one part and his wife Annie Prince formerly Annie Pope, and the children the said Annie Prince may have by the said Geo. W. Prince of the second part. Witnesseth: that in consideration of the natural love and affection which the said Geo. W. Prince bears towards his said wife & children, and also for other good causes & considerations, the said party of the first part hereby grant & convey with General warranty unto the parties of the second part the following parcel of land to wit: that certain tract of land commonly known as the Gray place, formerly belonging to estate Geo. C. Pope decd. containing 236 acres more or less, including the Store house & Gin house & bounded by the public road leading from Cross Keys to Jerusalem the lands of B. C. Pope decd. B. E. Pope, Walter L. Ritchlow & others, but this deed is made upon the following trusts and limitations to wit. The said Geo. W. Prince shall be entitled to manage & cultivate the said land so long as he may live, but neither the said land nor any profits arising therefrom shall in any wise be subject to any debt of his. The said land shall belong to the said Annie Prince during her life, and at her death, shall pass to her children in the event she leaves no child, nor the descendant of any child, it shall then revert to said Geo. W. Prince & his heirs.
