This Indenture made and entered into this 7<sup>th</sup> day of March in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred & eighty, between Etheldred J. Smith and wife Virginia F. Smith of the first part and Bennet E. Stephenson of the second part witnesseth: that for and in consideration of the sum of Two hundred and fifty dollars in hand paid to the parties of the first part by the party of the second part, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, the said parties of the first part have bargained and sold, and by this Indenture do bargain sell and convey unto the said Bennet E. Stephenson the party of the second part his heirs and assigns a certain tract or parcel of land situated in the County of Southampton and State of Virginia a containing twenty five acres more or less, it being the undivided one fourth (1/4) interest of said Etheldred J. Smith and to the land of which his mother the late Mrs. Mary M. Smith died, seized & possessed, to have and to hold said land and all privileges and appurtenances thereto belonging unto the said Bennet E. Stephenson his heirs and assigns to his & their only use and behoof, in fee simple, and the said parties of the first part do by this indenture covenant & defend the title of said land, to the said Bennet
